1. The heavy traffic moved slowly (through the tunnel.)

Labels: heavy (adj. → traffic), traffic (O.P.), moved (V), slowly (adv. → moved), through (prep. → tunnel), tunnel (O.P.).

2. Vic served (in the Army) (for several years.)

Labels: served (V), in (prep. → Army), Army (O.P.), for (prep. → years), years (O.P.).

3. Very shiny objects will attract fish (to the net.)

Labels: Very (adv. → shiny), shiny (adj. → objects), objects (O.P.), will (V), attract (V), fish (O.P.), to (prep. → net), net (O.P.).

4. (In ancient Rome,) men fought (with lions)

Labels: In (prep. → Rome), Rome (O.P.), ancient (adj. → Rome), men (O.P.), fought (V), with (prep. → lions), lions (O.P.).

(at the Colosseum.)

Labels: at (prep. → Colosseum), Colosseum (O.P.).

5. The laborer couldn't work (for several weeks.)

Labels: laborer (O.P.), couldn't (V), work (V), for (prep. → weeks), weeks (O.P.).

6. She played an electric guitar (in the concert.)

Labels: She (pron. → played), played (V), an (prep. → guitar), electric (adj. → guitar), guitar (O.P.), in (prep. → concert), concert (O.P.).

7. Harlem is a section (of Manhattan.)

ADJ. (pointing to Harlem)
prep. (pointing to of)
O.P. (pointing to Manhattan)

8. Great literature and music have been created (in Harlem.)

adj. (pointing to Great)
ADV. (pointing to Harlem)
prep. (pointing to in)
O.P. (pointing to Harlem)

9. I left the new store (after Jim Owens.)

pron. (pointing to I)
adj. (pointing to new)
prep. (pointing to after)
O.P. (pointing to Jim Owens)

10. The children sold lemonade (under the trees)

ADV. (pointing to Harlem)
prep. (pointing to under)
O.P. (pointing to trees)

(ADV. (pointing to Harlem)
prep. (pointing to by)
O.P. (pointing to roadside.)

11. (Before class), the teacher collected the papers.

ADV. (pointing to Harlem)
prep. (pointing to Before)
O.P. (pointing to class)

12. Ms. Zebroski wasn't present (at the wedding) yesterday.

adv. (pointing to yesterday)
adv. (pointing to wasn't)
adj. (pointing to present)
prep. (pointing to at)
O.P. (pointing to wedding)

13. The vendor (on the sidewalk) is selling bags (of peanuts.)

ADJ. (pointing to Harlem)
prep. (pointing to on)
O.P. (pointing to sidewalk)
ADJ. (pointing to Harlem)
prep. (pointing to of)
O.P. (pointing to peanuts)
